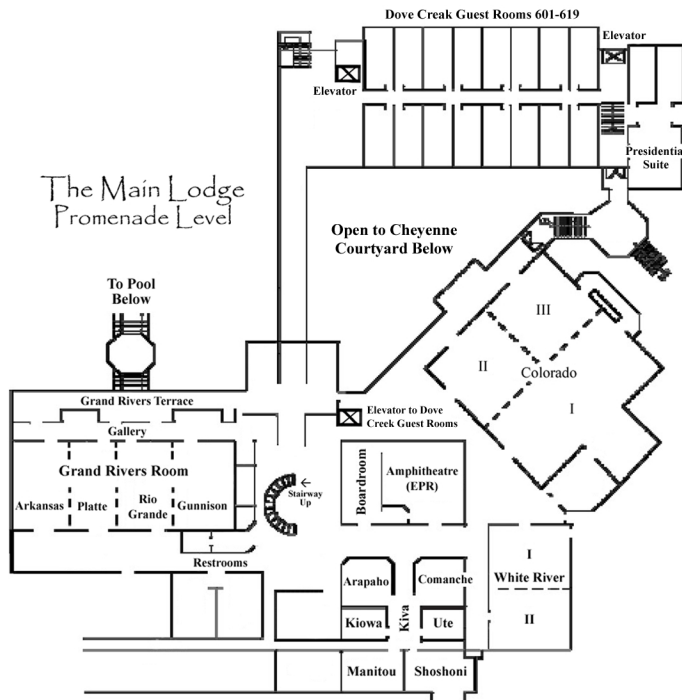
The Main Lodge

Terrace Level

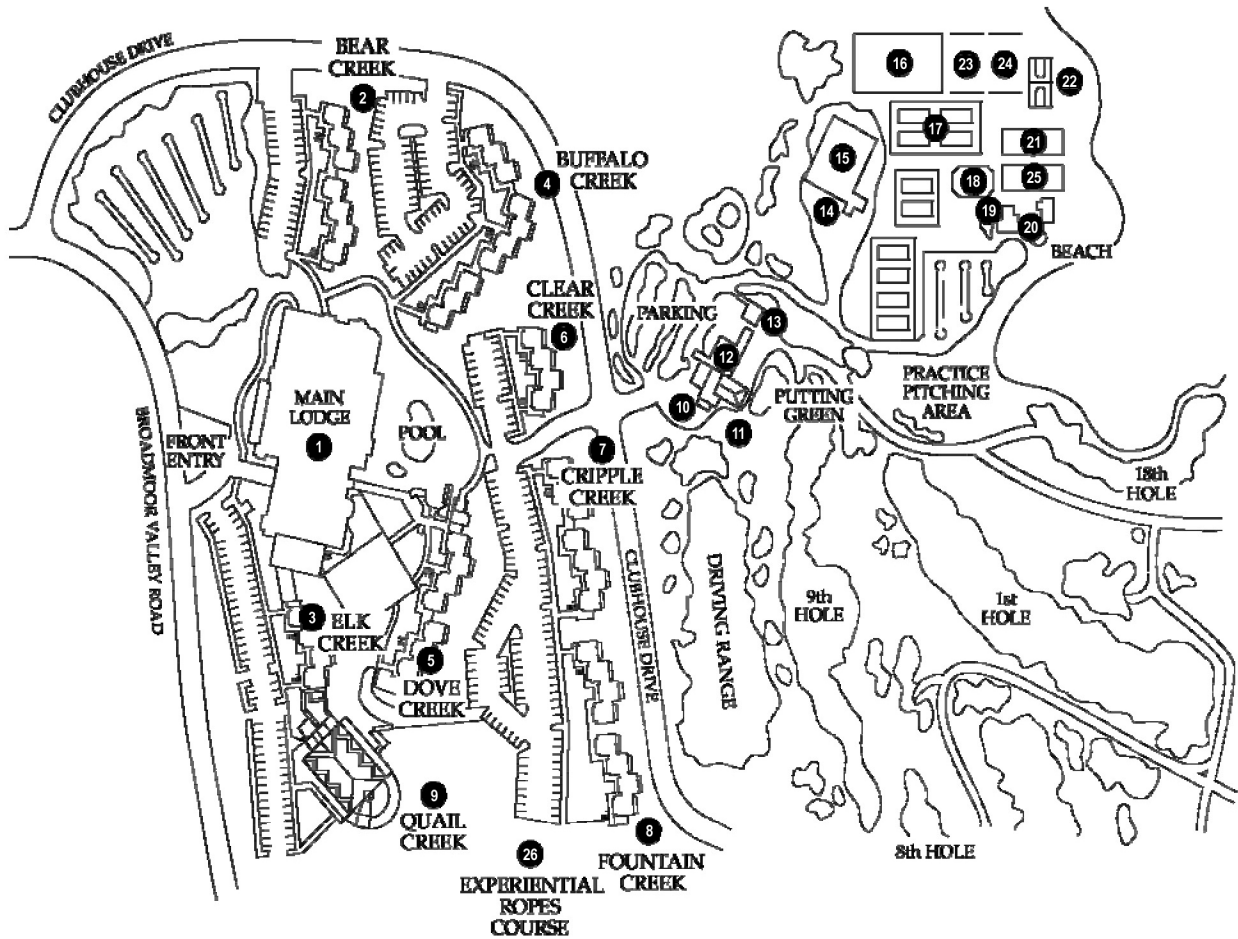


Quail Creek Lodge

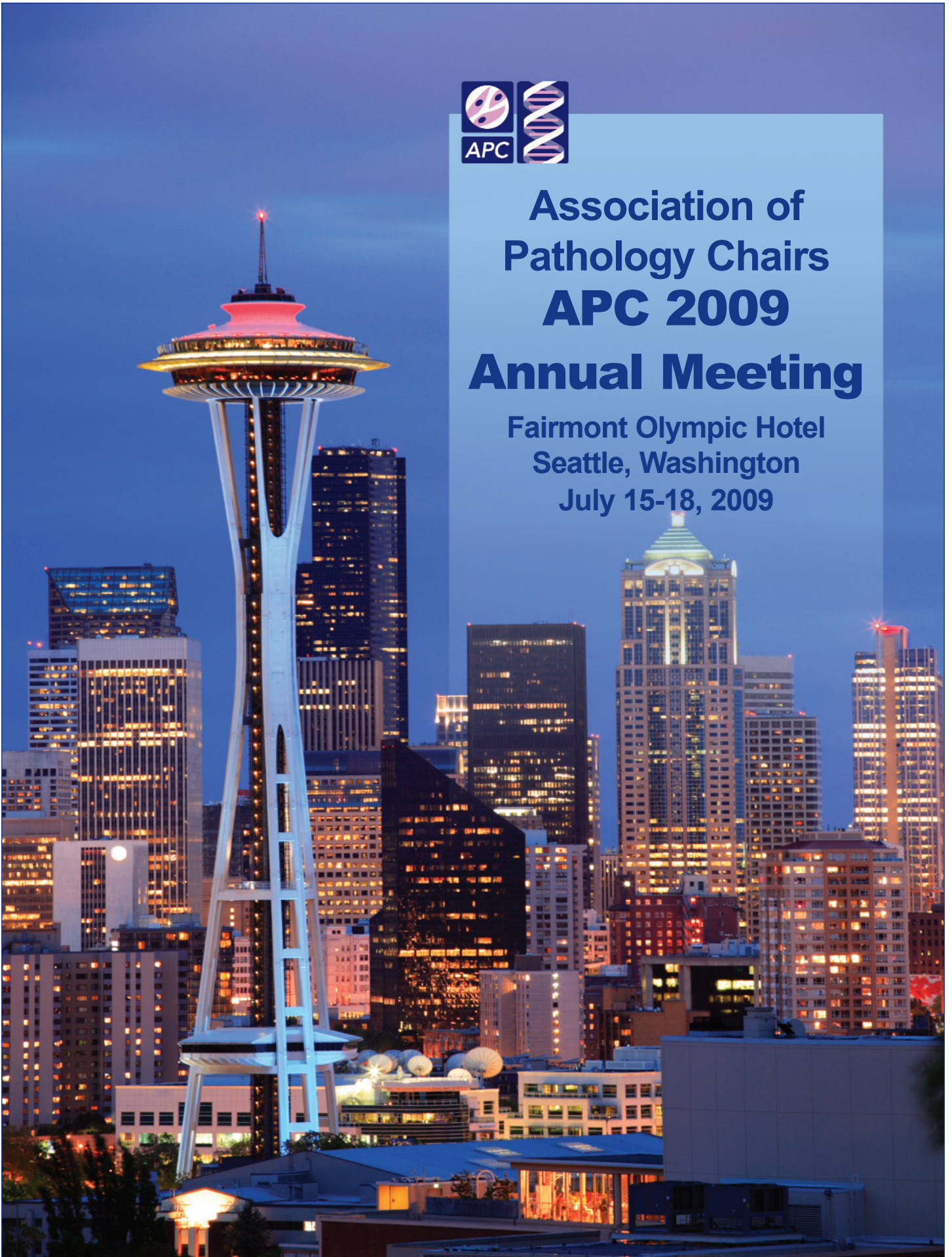
